





I N T E R C O N N E C T E D C O M P O N E N T S

- 2. A **Coalition** to reduce veteran suicide through meaningful actions, commitments, and cross-sector collaboration.
- **3. Grantmaking** focused on identifying crucial opportunities to scale evidence-informed interventions for suicide prevention and quickly respond to newly identified needs.







FOCUS AREAS

DYNAMIC DATA MODELING


What will it help us do?

Estimated Deaths by Suicide in Present Conditions


Projected Deaths by Suicide





Let's focus on 10,000 veterans who are in High suicide-related distress group.


Without Face the Fight Interventions, we assume present suicide rates continue.


Clinical vs Non - Clinical


